Reopening... and reinventing


There's no doubt about it. The workplace will never quite be the same again.

Reviewing policies & procedures

Businesses will need to scrutinise current policies and protocols and adapt if they are to re-open in a feasible, manageable and safe way.

Exactly how to go about this will depend on the workspace and industry in question, but new clearly defined procedures and practices will be part of the "new normal".

Areas for employers to think about include:

Access control and entry policies

New procedures and vetting processes will be needed to mitigate the risk of bringing illness into the workplace.

Maintaining social distances

Ensuring social distance is observed will mean adapting open-plan offices and hot-desking policies.

Office equipment

The use of shared computers, printers and other items will need to be reassessed and appropriate changes made.

PPE

Some shared spaces will require the use of personal protective equipment, particularly in workspaces where social distancing cannot be maintained.

Monitoring of cleaning schedules

More rigorous cleaning of shared spaces will now be the norm, with a much larger emphasis on recording cleaning schedules likely.

Daily office cleans will need to be more frequent and visible efforts shown to put employees mind at ease.




Limiting the spread of infection & germs
